SUBJECT: **Information Meeting- National Disaster Resiliency Competition
Application- Phase II**

As a result of the Rim Fire, Tuolumne County was selected by the State of California to participate in the National Disaster Resiliency Competition (NDRC) Application. This application consists of two phases. The first phase NDRC Application was finalized and submitted to Housing and Urban Development (HUD) March of 2015 for review and ranking. In mid-June the State received notice that our NDRC application was approved and we were invited to submit a Phase II application.

In late June, the California NDRC Team sent out a call for potential projects. At the deadline close, the Team had received over 140 project sheets. We have been going through all of the proposals and reviewing them based upon the overall State application objectives and examining what is allowable under HUD rules and regulations. Before we get any further in the process, the NDRC Team would like to meet with the public to discuss the Phase II application.
