



**Riding Tips**

Arrive early to your bus stop. Please be sure to stand in an area where the bus driver can see you. Give the bus driver a wave to let him know that you wish to board. To make sure you are boarding the right bus, check with the driver. Please let those exiting the bus do so before you board. Let your driver know where you want to get off as you board the bus. Watch your step when boarding or exiting the bus.

Upon boarding the bus, deposit exact fare, ticket, transfer or show the driver your pass. **Please note that drivers do not carry change.** Ridership is limited to a space available basis. Passengers may be required to wait for the next fixed route bus if a Dial-A-Ride is unavailable.

Children under the age of six (6) years of age must be accompanied by an older child (12+) or an adult. Please seatbelt infants or small children weighing under 40 pounds in a child safety restraint seat or held on your lap as required by State Law. Passengers should remain seated, or in one place while the bus is in motion. Seatbelts are recommended.

**Rules to Ride By**

Pets, other than service animals, are not permitted on board.

Radios, tapeplayers or CD players may only be played through earphones, at a volume unheard by other passengers.

Shirts and shoes must be worn at all times, and wet clothing such as swim suits are prohibited. However, wet clothing due to weather conditions is only discouraged.

Eating and smoking are prohibited. Drinking of non-alcoholic beverages is permitted only from plastic enclosed spill proof containers.

All hazardous items, such as toxic materials (gasoline, explosives, flammable liquids, etc.) or unpackaged plate glass, are strictly prohibited due to public safety.

Please keep aisles clear. Packages, strollers and shopping carts should be kept under the seats or folded between seats. State law requires the area between the driver and the front door be kept clear at all times. Large bulky items are prohibited, but fishing poles and other recreational equipment may be permitted at the drivers discretion. Items that roll, such as skateboards, must be held securely while on board.

All Tuolumne County Transit riders are expected to conduct themselves courteously. The privilege of using Tuolumne County Transit may be revoked at any time if the rider is abusive, offensive or insulting to any other passengers or a transit employee, or engages in any conduct or activity which is hazardous to any persons, or damages, vandalizes or destroys any property of the transit operator or the County of Tuolumne.

Refusal to comply with any rules may result in the passenger's removal from the bus. Drivers are authorized to summon law enforcement officials to ensure passenger safety and efficient transit service.



**Tuolumne County Transit is fully accessible**

All Tuolumne County Transit buses are wheelchair accessible.

**Mobility Devices/Wheelchair users** should remain in their chair and wear a lap belt during loading and unloading, as well as when riding on Tuolumne County Transit.

**Wheelchairs** are required to be in good working order with functional brakes. Scooter users should transfer to a seat if possible. Please note drivers will not push wheelchairs up or down inclines or over barriers, and all mobility devices will be secured to the bus.

**Scooter users** should contact the transit office (532-0404) as not all scooters can be loaded or secured on Tuolumne County Transit vehicles and special arrangements may need to be made.

**Attendants** for persons certified as disabled (pursuant to the Americans with Disabilities Act) and requiring the assistance of a care attendant, may be accompanied by the attendant free of charge.
