	✓ Update your facility call center &/or answering service
	✓ Notify the MHOAC of the status of your facility
Limit avnasura ta smaka	✓ Monitor air quality reports
Limit exposure to smoke	✓ Keep indoor air clean by closing windows & doors
	✓ Use recycle or recirculate mode on air conditioners
	✓ When smoke levels are high, do not increase pollution. Do not vacuum.
	✓ Patients or staff with asthma or lung disease to follow advice of physician
	and/or Health Officer
	✓ Consider using N95 masks when outdoors (fitted properly)
Recovery	✓ If facility is damaged, wait for official approval to enter
Recovery	✓ Use caution. Some fire hazards may still exist
	✓ Wet debris to minimize breathing particles
	✓ Wear protective equipment, such as heavy gloves & footwear
	✓ Power breakers should be on. However, fires may cause breakers to trip. If
	breakers are on & there is no power, contact utility company. Do not reset
	breakers without inspection from a licensed electrician.
	✓ If a propane tank is present, contact propane supplier. If appropriately trained,
	maintenance staff should turn off valves on the system
