Pet Emergency & Evacuation Preparedness

What YOU can do!

ALWAYS PLAN AHEAD

- Have a go bag or evacuation kit pre-packed, ready for you & your pet
- Ensure your pets & livestock are properly identified, microchip is best
- Identify a safe & pet friendly alternative location to stay ahead of time i.e. hotel, friend or relative house
- Think about secure transportation during a stressful time & practice with your pet(s)
 - i.e. cats carriers, dogs- crates, practice trailering your livestock etc.







Emergency & Evacuation Preparedness

Livestock & Larger Animals

- Livestock and large animals requiring trailer transportation should be considered during your emergency preparation & planning
- Livestock should be evacuated as early as possible to minimize risks
- Practice loading, unloading and general trailer etiquette with your large animals to ensure that they will be able to load easily in the event of an emergency.
- Emergency evacuation supply kits should also be prepared for your large animals
- Identification of your large animal should be considered in case you are separated i.e. branding, tagging, chalk/paint, microchipping etc.
- If you live nearby others owning livestock it is often advantageous to work together



What goes in your pet's emergency kit?





A sturdy leash, collar, harness, leads, halters, etc. for controlling your pet, a muzzle if necessary



Food & drinking water, bowls, cat litter pan & litter, can opener for food if needed



Medications, copies of vet & vaccine records



First aid supplies for pet, name and contact information for your veterinarian



Current photo of you & your pet for ID purposes



*Not necessary, but helpful:

Pet crates, carriers, bedding, toys, clean up supplies
