





### Groveland Fuelbreak Maintenance Project


### Belleview Kewin Mill Fuels Reduction Project




# Dragoon Gulch Fuel Reduction Project

- Approx. 89 acres, approx. 50 acres hand work, 39 acres mastication
- 40+- acres of City property is included
